GETTING HERE

By Car from

North: A66 and A1(M) East: A1(M), A61 and A59. South: A65, A660, M62 and M1. West: A65, A59 and M65,

By Bus

Regular buses: Harrogate-Pateley Bridge (no. 24), and Leeds-Harrogate-Ripon (no. 36). Additional services by DalesBus all year round, including Upper Nidderdale. For all services and timetables please visit www.dalesbus.org

By Train

To Harrogate (regular services from London, Leeds and York) and Ilkley (regular services from Leeds and Bradford), with regular onward bus services into Nidderdale National Landscape.

By Plane

Leeds Bradford International Airport is 4 miles south of Nidderdale National Landscape. Regular bus services run from the airport to Harrogate and Otley where connecting services run into the National Landscape.

WALKING WITH DOGS

The open spaces and stunning countryside of Nidderdale National Landscape are wonderful to explore with your dog. However, dogs can pose a danger to animals and birds. A few simple steps can make a huge difference:

Always keep your dog on a short lead around livestock and on moorland

Stick to the footpaths.

Check signs for local restrictions.

Clean up after your dog.

If you feel threatened by cows let your dog off the lead.

You're birdwatchers, history buffs, wildlife lovers, keen walkers, mountain bikers or maybe just in search of the peace and tranquillity a National Landscape affords.

HELP US TO PROTECT THIS SPECIAL LANDSCAPE BY:

Always keeping your dog on a short lead when near livestock and on moorland.

Preventing uncontrolled fires which can be started so easily by BBQs, cigarette ends and spent matches.

Protecting plants and animals by taking your litter and dog poo home.

Following the Countryside Code, scan the QR code for full details.



CHECK-CLEAN-DRY

Help prevent the spread of non-native species and wildlife diseases by:

Checking for and removing any mud or plant material, leaving them on site.

Cleaning your shoes thoroughly.

Drying them as well as you can.





HELP US TO PROTECT VULNERABLE BIRDS

Between 1 March and 31 July, please keep your dog on a lead even if there is no livestock on the land. This is to protect birds that nest on the ground, such as curlew and lapwing. You can't always see them but they can be disturbed very easily by dogs, causing them to leave their nests which leaves their young vulnerable.

Many of these birds are now endangered and we are working very hard to protect them.


